



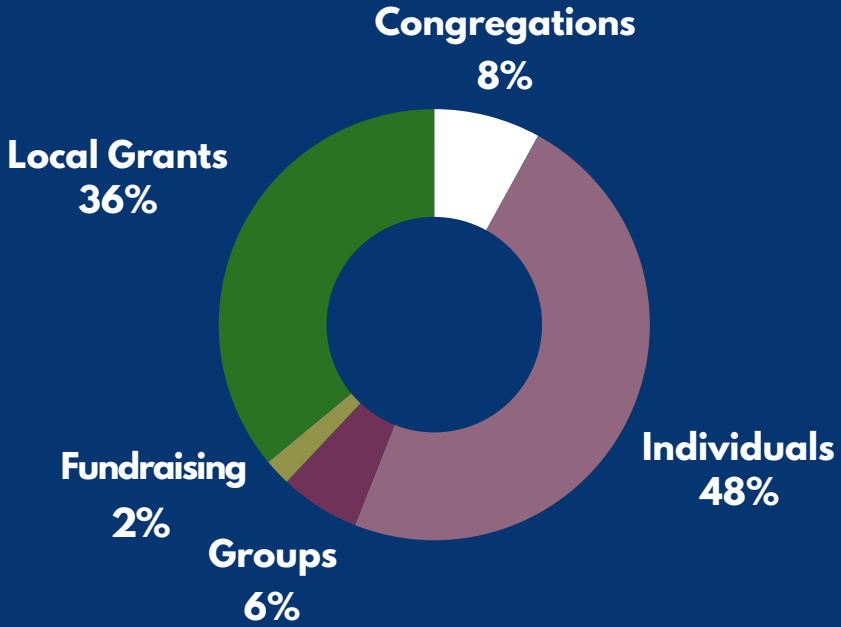

When Neighbors Need Food

Across all four food programs, over 800 families were served each month from our food pantry. In 2024, this totaled 4,736 instances of groceries served to our neighbors served in McCracken County.

We provide at least a four-day supply of groceries. For those with limited or no storage or cooking facilities, we offered ready-to eat, take-away foods such as canned meats, fruit, juice, and energy bars.

When Neighbors Need a Helping Hand —Support Services

Throughout 2024 we provided support services totaling \$150,000. PCM's support services provide financial assistance and connect individuals who have experienced homelessness with partner organizations, helping to break the cycle of instability and foster long-term self-sufficiency.

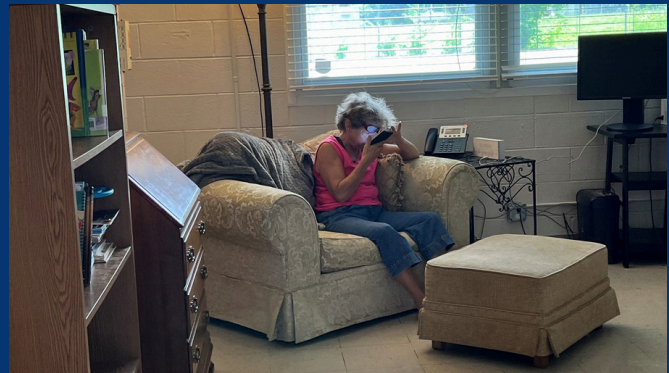

Homeless Services

In 2024, our Fresh Start Village for homeless women and women with children sheltered 91 adults and 70 children for a total of 18,609 nights. The average stay was 116 days per household.

76% of Fresh Start guests found stable housing upon departure from the Village in 2024, 95% of Fresh Start adults exited with income in 2024.

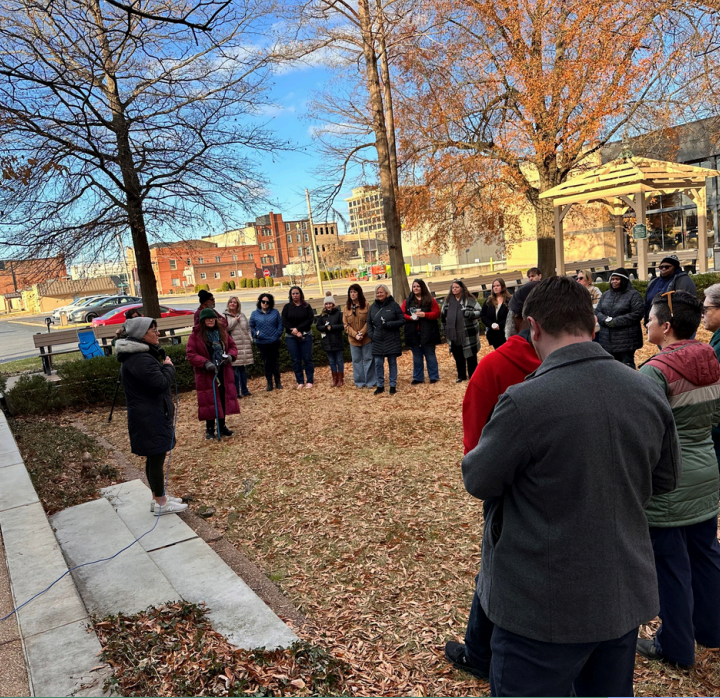
